

4 FIRST-AID MEASURES IN CASE OF PESTICIDE POISONING

EARLY SYMPTOMS OF PESTICIDE POISONING



SKIN
Irritation, burning, staining



EYES
Itching, burning, watering



BREATHING
Coughs, chest pains and tightness, headaches



ORAL
Burning in mouth and throat, dribbling saliva, nausea, vomiting, stomach pains, diarrhoea

FIRST-AID TREATMENT WHEN EARLY SYMPTOMS OCCUR



Pesticide splashes in the eye. Hold eyelid(s) open and wash eyes with clean, running water for 10 minutes or more

Pesticide splashes or spills onto skin. Wash exposed skin with soap and plenty clean cold water.



Pesticide has been swallowed. Induce vomiting pesticide is very dangerous (purple). For other types of poison dilute by giving the victim plenty of clean water to drink. [DO NOT GIVE MILK]
